The Deschutes Land Trust is seeking a Stewardship Associate to join its dedicated team!

Who We Are:

The Deschutes Land Trust conserves and cares for the lands and waters that sustain Central Oregon, so local communities and the natural world can flourish together for generations to come. Since 1995, the Land Trust has protected more than 17,500 acres throughout Central Oregon for future generations. We embrace diversity, equity, and inclusion, and are committed to building a conservation community with diverse backgrounds, cultures, and life experiences. What You'll Do:

The Stewardship Associate assists with restoration, vegetation management planning and implementation, infrastructure and equipment maintenance, general property management, and volunteer engagement. This is a core position of the stewardship team, dedicated to restoring and protecting the long-term ecological resiliency of our properties. The Stewardship Associate reports to the Stewardship Manager and works collaboratively with the entire Stewardship Department, other Land Trust Staff, and Board Members.

Essential Functions:

Land Stewardship

- Work autonomously and with contractors to treat identified weed populations on Land Trust conserved lands. Weed management may include hand pulling, mechanical treatment and using herbicides via backpack sprayer, ATV etc.
- Update and maintain property weed maps and treatment tracking data.
- Monitor weed populations after implementation of restoration projects, work with Stewardship Manager to develop treatment plan.
- Develop invasive weed biocontrol program.
- Implement agricultural field restoration (using traditional farming methods to convert fallow and crop fields to native vegetation).
- Maintain facilities, farm equipment, fences and other tools and infrastructure (identify issues, problem solve, work with volunteers/contractors/etc.) on various properties.
- Assist with various other native plant restoration projects.
- Assist with baseline inventory data collection and general mapping projects.
- Assist stewardship staff as needed on identified priority stewardship projects.

Community Engagement

- Work with volunteers to hand pull targeted weed populations. Collect and dispose of pulled weeds.
- Work with staff on engaging/orienting volunteers on weed removal, facility maintenance, and other Preserve needs.
- Lead and assist with volunteer work parties and property tours as needed.

- Meet and communicate with neighbors regarding cooperative management along shared property boundaries.
- Assist with development of community science programs and relevant partnerships.

Work environment

- This position is located in Central Oregon.
- This position regularly works in an office or home office setting and in the field at Land Trust protected lands and sometime requires working evenings and weekends.
- This position requires moderate to extensive travel to Land Trust protected properties throughout Central Oregon.
- This position may require travel to a remote location and living on site for several weeks per year.
- Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions of the position.

What you Need:

- **Conservation Commitment:** Passion and commitment to the mission, vision, and values of the Deschutes Land Trust.
- **Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Experience:** Cultural competency skills and demonstrated ability to work with people of diverse races, ages, genders, abilities, and economic backgrounds. Experience with and commitment to applying diversity, equity and inclusion principles and practices within an organization to programs.

• Restoration skills:

- Familiarity with or aptitude to learn irrigation systems including hand line and K-Line systems and ability to set up and operate these systems.
- Familiarity with or aptitude to learn to apply traditional farming methods (plowing, disking, seeding, mowing, etc.) to restoration projects.
- The ability to safely use ATV's, UTV's, tractors, farm implements and drive a truck with trailer to perform work.
- o Central Oregon botanical knowledge and plant ID experience.
- o Experience identifying and managing weeds in an ecosystem similar to Central Oregon.
- Current herbicide applicator license or willingness to obtain.
- o Experience with basic facilities management and maintenance.
- **Communication Skills:** Proven ability to communicate effectively, tactfully, and diplomatically in writing and in person with a diverse community of supporters including volunteers, donors, community-based partners, and Land Trust staff and Board.
- Organization Skills: Excellent organizational skills including attention to detail, and ability to create efficiencies and build organizational systems. Ability to set priorities and meet deadlines to complete projects efficiently and effectively while managing multiple priorities.
- **Technology Skills:** Strong computer skills, including proficiency with navigational equipment and apps, data collection/mapping/management.
- **Outdoor Skills:** Ability and interest in working in an outdoor environment, including navigating rugged terrain in all weather conditions.

Also helpful, but not required:

• Experience, background, or education in rangeland ecology.
