The Deschutes Land Trust is seeking a Restoration Specialist to join its dedicated team!

Who We Are:

The Deschutes Land Trust conserves and cares for the lands and waters that sustain Central Oregon, so local communities and the natural world can flourish together for generations to come. Since 1995, the Land Trust has protected more than 18,700 acres throughout Central Oregon for future generations. What You'll Do:

The Restoration Specialist develops, leads fundraising for, and oversees implementation of floodplain restoration work on Land Trust conserved lands. The Restoration Specialist reports to the Stewardship Director and may oversee some associate-level restoration staff. This position works collaboratively with all Land Trust staff and Board Members to build support for the Land Trust and responsibly steward conserved lands.

Essential Functions:

Management and Planning

- Assess floodplain restoration potential on Land Trust conserved lands and develop strategies for implementation.
- Identify potential funding sources for restoration projects and develop and implement fundraising strategies, including grant writing and grant management.
- Develop and maintain productive relationships with funders, agencies, community partners, and other organizations and individuals associated with restoration projects.
- Participate in annual stewardship planning and budget development.
- Understand stewardship best practices and monitor trends, issues, and regulations that may affect the Land Trust.
- Support organizational efforts to build Tribal partnerships and strengthen Tribal community relations.
- Support DEI expansion throughout the Land Trust organizational culture and integration into stewardship practices.
- Assist with hiring new stewardship staff, training/oversight of some associate position(s), and annual review and evaluation of assigned associate position(s).

Land Stewardship

- Lead development, management, and monitoring of floodplain restoration projects.
- Manage independent contractors and consultants associated with restoration activities.
- Work with Conservation Director, Stewardship Director, and other lands staff to plan for and assess potential land transactions.

Community Engagement

- Build and maintain positive relationships with community partners, supporters, donors, media, and other stakeholders.
- Engage with volunteers, lead public and private tours, and participate in targeted events to build community connections and stewardship.
- Assist with the development of floodplain restoration-related content for various outreach materials (website, social media, press releases, etc)

What You Need:

- Conservation Commitment: Passion and commitment to the mission, vision, and values of the Deschutes Land Trust. Strong desire to be part of the Land Trust community.
- **Eagerness to Learn/Growth Mindset:** Willingness to approach work with sense of curiosity and creativity, and to seek out opportunities to learn through experience and practice. Ability to see challenges as an opportunity for growth and adaptation.
- **Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Commitment:** Commitment to applying diversity, equity and inclusion principles and practices within an organization to programs. Commitment to fostering an inclusive Land Trust community, where people of all identities are represented and feel welcome.
- Floodplain Restoration Experience: at least 2 years of experience managing complex floodplain restoration projects, including funding, assessment and design, implementation, and monitoring.
- **Relationship Building Skills:** Excellent interpersonal skills and ability to build trusting relationships through empathetic and thoughtful listening. Ability to engage with people across a range of perspectives and find common ground with diverse interests.
- **Communication Skills:** Proven ability to communicate effectively in writing and in person with a diverse set of partners including local Tribal communities, partner organizations, funding entities, agencies, and contractors. Ability to interpret complex restoration goals and strategies and synthesize into compelling and easily understood talking points.
- **Organization Skills:** Excellent organizational skills including attention to detail, time-management skills, and the ability to create efficiencies. Ability to set priorities and meet deadlines to complete projects efficiently and effectively while managing multiple priorities.
- **Self-motivated:** Able to work on project elements with low to moderate level of supervision.
